"A pretty mix of ocean breeze, green fruit, lemon rind and saline nuances introduces mouth coating, intense and punchy medium-bodied flavors that possess fine precision and lovely minerality though only average depth on the otherwise clean, balanced and persistent finish. 2015+"

## 2010 VINTAGE

"Restrained nose of flowers, honey, green and stony fruit. Plenty of oak shows through but it is well done so adds lovely complexity. It is almost chewy with pure, zippy citrus fruit flavour and a good minerality finish. Lots of potential. Classic and delicious. Drink: 2013-2018."

## 2006 VINTAGE

« This Chablis Premier cru Montée de Tonnerre 2006 comes from the soil considered as the best of the Premier Crus of Chablis. It is well-built, perfectly balanced enter minéralité and fruity mature, finale leaving in mouth of the flavours rather musky. A temperament which allows it to accompany shellfishes, but also white meats with the cream. » Le Républicain Lorrain – Oct. 2009

« Exceptional because of its location (on a mid slope on the place Pied d'Aloup in the heart of the Montée de Tonnerre appellation), this wine is considered as the first of the Premiers Crus of Chablis. » Jours de chasse - Autumn 2008

« This famous company proposes beautiful white wines that are subtle and appealing. This wine is a vivid example. The Chardonnay is very expressive with persistence and elegance. » La Depeche - Dec. 2008

« On the right side of the river Serein, in the heart of the appellation Montrée de Tonnerre Premier Cru . The soil is stony with clay. Harvested end of September the grapes benefited from a nice Indian summer to mature in the best conditions. Beautiful colour with green tinges. Complex floral aromas mixed with white fruit. The palate is balanced with pretty salty notes and a long finish. Le Berry Republicain – Jul. 2008

«The Chardonnay produced from this parcel shows aromatic finesse and the minerality of its terroir. The Montée de Tonnerre is considered, namely because of its placement, as one of the leaders of the Premiers Crus of Chablis.
